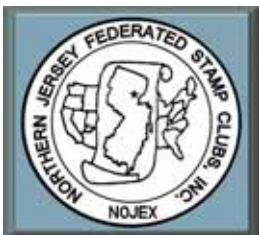
May 15th Meeting

Our May meeting will feature a slide show provided by the APS on "Number Ones of the World". According to the description, the program begins by asking what exactly constitutes the designation Number One: Is it the actual first stamp issued by a particular country, or only the one listed in a stamp catalogue as number "1"? The "first" stamp issues of many countries are reviewed, beginning with the Penny Black in 1840 and ending with the Dutch Indies first issue of 1864. Also explored are the conditions in various countries that led them to begin issuing stamps when they did.

Ben Burwell will give a presentation on the new HTPS website at the meeting. We should also have time for a "Show & Tell". If you have an interesting philatelic item or a story you would like to share, please bring it to the meeting.

April Presentation – Hank Applegate

Our April presentation was by Hank Applegate, president of the Lakehurst Historical Society, on the Naval Air Station. He explained the history of the station, beginning with the conversion from army Camp Kendrick to the Air Station and



the construction of the 962 foot long zeppelin hanger. He then gave us the history of the various dirigibles that were stationed or visited Lakehurst from 1921 to 1939 and showed photos of a number of flight covers.

Among the zeppelins stationed at Lakehurst was the USS Shenandoah, built in 1923, which made the first crossing of the North American continent by airship; the USS Akron and USS Macon which both crashed shortly after being commissioned, and the USS Los Angeles, built in Germany, converted from hydrogen to helium, and remained part of the US fleet until 1939.

Hank also showed a number of covers from various visiting airships including the Graf Zeppelin and the Hindenburg. He ended his talk showing some event covers including one from the 50th anniversary of the Hindenburg disaster of May 6th, 1937, signed by all the surviving passengers and crew from that fateful trip.

We thank Hank for taking the time to come and make his very interesting presentation.

Trenton Cover



Earlier in the year, Neil Wood was in Fall River, Massachusetts and found a Trenton cover at a local stamp store that might interest the club membership. It has a corner card for a financial broker (E.B. Sterling) but also contains references to selling United States stamps and catalogues.



The cover is from Edward Boker Sterling, a famous collector and dealer of U.S. Revenue stamps. He also published the first catalog of revenue stamps and was elected to the A.P.S. Hall of Fame in 1967. Perhaps some member can tell us more about Mr. Sterling? Incidentally, the cover cost Neil \$1.00.
