

February Proceedings

We had another large turnout for our February meeting including several guests who joined us for the evening. In fact, one of the guests became a member of the HTPS. There were many interesting "Show & Tell" presentations.



Jim Cope showed a New Zealand "Glow in the Dark" cover that featured recently issued lighthouse stamps. Joe Seliga

described the two volume Deegam Handbook on Machins that he obtained from the APS Library. John Ranto showed a framed set of postcards from the 1940's showing life at Fort Dix.

Don Bunker passed around a 1930 National Geographic article containing the first use of color aerial photographs. They were taken from a zeppelin. Dennis Buss commented on a recent TV show, *American Stamps*, describing the work of the designers who create U.S. postage stamps.

The highlight of the meeting was a talk by Andy Kupersmit on a behind the scenes look at an auction house. Andy is a professional auctioneer who has worked at a number of auction houses.

Andy gave an overview of the auction process, starting with the consignment of the material, proceeding through the preparation of the auction catalog, the actual auction, and ending with the final accounting.



He brought up a number of situations such as how a collection is divided into lots, or what happens when there is a question as to the authenticity of the material. Andy also touched on why people consign, or sell, their stamps and how you, as a collector, can maximize the value of a collection.


We thank Andy for a fascinating talk. Even the most experienced buyers in the room learned a thing or two on the inner workings of an auction.

During the last two decades, John Ranto, a long time HTPS member, has created an unusual collection of first day and event covers. In addition to using traditional cachet formats, John often selects magazines, post office notices and other philatelic materials as a background for his work.

Philatelic Pieces – Louis Braille

Along with Abraham Lincoln and Charles Darwin, 2009 celebrates the 200th anniversary of Louis Braille's birth. Louis Braille was born on Jan. 4, 1809, in Coupvray, France.



At the age of three, he became blind due to an accident. In 1819 Braille earned a scholarship to the Royal Institution for Blind Youth in Paris, where he became an accomplished cellist and organist.

Between 1821 and 1824, he developed a system of six raised dots that corresponded to letters and that could be read with a single fingertip. The first book in Braille was published in 1829. Louis Braille died in 1852 from tuberculosis.

Many countries are issuing stamps and souvenir sheets honoring his bicentenary. Below is a French stamp issued on Jan 4 of this year. Note that the braille dots indicate the face value of €0.55.



APS Stamp Album Pages

Two more sets of APS-created stamp album pages were released in February. The first group houses a bicentennial tribute to Abraham Lincoln.

The 16 page PDF-formatted album has space and information for over 90 color-illustrated U.S. stamps, cut squares, postcards and other Lincoln philatelic items issued by the USPS.
