

September's Meeting

We all look forward to the September HTPS meeting as it marks the start of another stamp collecting season. It's also the time to renew old friendships and learn more about the hobby we love. Last month's meeting was no exception, and the room was abuzz with good conversation and an interesting presentation.

The highlight of the meeting was a talk on Philatelic Literature by Steven J. Rod. Steven, who spoke last year on "Nassau Street", is a noted philatelic writer and Vice President of the A.P.S. He stressed the importance of learning about the stamps we collect, or as he put it, being a philatelist and not just a stamp collector. He described the different types of literature – catalogs, periodicals, books and the internet – and showed some interesting examples.

He told the story of the first stamp catalog by J.W. Scott in 1868 and compared a copy of Linn's Stamp News from thirty years ago, which was the size of a newspaper with two large sections, with today's thin magazine size. He also showed other examples of early philatelic literature and publications.

As an added bonus, Steven brought along a very small portion of the large literature collection (nine tons!) of the late George W. Brett, a noted philatelic writer who was considered the authority on United States stamp production. Brett's literature collection is being sold to benefit his estate, the U.S. Postal Museum and the U.S. Stamp Society. Many club members were able to pick up a book or two at greatly reduced prices.

Steven also provided free auction catalogs from the 1990's including estate and specialized editions for Newfoundland, Mexico, Shanghai and Louis Grunin's Great Britain Mulready's.

We thank Steven for taking the time to come down and talk to us. Hopefully, we will heed his advice and all become better "philatelists" in the future.

Stamp Identification

We were surprised that no correct answer was submitted for last month's stamp. However, it was an unusual issue with no easily identifiable markings. The stamp was Tanna Tuva #1 issued in 1926.



This month we have a beautifully engraved issue.

No clues since the markings and text have previously appeared in this column. One dollar worth of face value stamps from the U.S. box to the first correct identification.

The eight sections provide introduction to an array of information from basic collecting to more advanced topics. To further research an item, just click on the link to the original source.


Stamp Link™, at www.stamplink.com, is a more basic site, but still provides lots of links to philatelic information. Both sites reference each other.

A new show has opened in our area. Located at the Ramada Inn on Route 206 in Bordentown, it's less than 6 miles from Hamilton (closer than the Hightstown show).

The show bills itself as a Coin, Stamp and Postcard show. There were mostly coin dealers present, and two stamp dealers: Fred Lisciandro, who has a table at Hightstown, handles mostly U.S. stamps and a variety of bulk lots. Steve Goceliak also sells at Hightstown and specializes in foreign stamps.
