

November Proceedings . . . by Tony Zingale

The business portion of our meeting started with the flag salute, reading of the minutes from the last meeting and the treasurer's report.

Our president, **Jeff Boyarsky**, related that he succeeded in placing a notice of the HTPS meetings in his senior community notices. He asked that other members check with their community boards to see if they would do the same.

It was reported that several HTPS members – **John Ranto, Ron Dobrowolski** and **Sherman Britton** – are not feeling well. Also, **Warren Scheible** is back in rehab for his foot. The group wished them all a speedy recovery.

Tony Zingale provided four large boxes of "Books on Tape" (aka "audiobooks") for sale. These are unabridged books on tape cassettes. Tony has over 1,000 titles priced at ten cents (10¢) per cassette with a maximum of \$1.00 for any audiobooks on more than ten cassettes. All proceeds go to the "Friends of the Library" (FOTL) group who raise money to purchase furniture and computer equipment for our host – the Hamilton Township Public Library.



Our presentation for the evening, *Forgeries & Fakes from the Philatelic Foundation*, was provided by **Robert G. Rose**.

Bob is a philatelic renaissance man – Philatelist – Author – President of the New Jersey Postal History Society – Chairman of NOJEX – Chairman of the Board of Trustees for the Philatelic Foundation.

Bob showed a variety of counterfeited and forged philatelic items that the Philatelic Foundation (PF) has acquired over the years.

His presentation focused on U.S. issues starting with U.S. #1 and continued into the early 20th century. The example at the right is typical of early fakes – a cover with real U.S. #1-2 stamps, but with the two pen cancels removed and replaced with a counterfeit postmark. An identical fake postmark was also applied to the left side of the cover.

What followed was a seemingly endless and dazzling array of forged and faked philatelic material including stamps, proofs and covers!

An interesting cover is shown below. I never knew how they created a grill – now I know one method. Note that the recipient's town of Marblehead, MA is the home town of HTPS member **Jack Sack**.

One example showed a stamp proof which was "shaved" to mimic a postage stamp. Another fake had paper ADDED to a postage stamp to resemble a stamp proof. Of course, Bob showed some perf stamp issues that were trimmed to become coils. He also showed some imperfs that had fake perfs added.

Our thanks to Bob Rose for another informative and entertaining presentation.

ASDA Fall Show

The American Stamp Dealers Association (ASDA) has announced that the fall 2014 ASDA National Postage Stamp Show will be held in a new venue – the New York Hilton hotel, located at 1335 Avenue of the Americas (aka 6th Avenue) in New York City. 2014 is the 100th anniversary of the ASDA so extra events are planned.



The ASDA plans to make the Hilton the permanent location for the fall show. The spring show will continue to be held at the New Yorker hotel.

The Hilton will provide one floor for all show activities marking a difference from the New Yorker hotel. 80 to 90 dealers are expected to attend and will include dealers from around the country. A USPS booth is also planned. There will also be floor space for non-competitive exhibits.



APS Album Pages

For the past few years, the American Philatelic Society (APS) has provided downloadable stamp albums, in PDF format, for the general collector.

The albums are offered in three categories:

- Countries
- States / Cities
- Thematic / Topical



The latest album is the first volume in the *Military History of America* and covers the French and Indian War through the War of 1812 (cover page shown at the left).

Albums range from a few pages to over 30. The albums are not meant to be comprehensive, but rather to illustrate stamps that the average collector has a reasonable chance to acquire.

Background information and descriptions are included and most albums provide Scott Catalog numbers. To date, more than 50 FREE albums are available for downloading.

USPS Rate Changes

The new year brings another round of postal rate changes. Effective, January 27, 2013, some USPS postage rates will change for single-piece First-Class Mail including:

- Letters (1 oz.) – 46¢ (up 1¢)
- Letters additional ounces – 20¢ (unchanged)
- Postcards – 33¢ (up 1¢)
- Letters to Canada/Mexico (1 oz.) – \$1.10 (up 25¢)
- Letters to Other Countries (1 oz.) – \$1.10 (up 5¢)

Price changes are also planned for priority mail and other postal services. Information on the new pricing is available at: about.usps.com/news/national-releases/2012/pr12_114.htm (underscore after “pr12”).
